

Carroll Overton Alley, Jr. was born in Richmond, Virginia to Carroll Overton Alley, Sr. and Mittie Points Alley. He graduated from John Marshall High School, where he was a member of the Cadet Corps, a swimmer, and an allaround outstanding student. He earned

his Bachelor's Degree—and later an honorary doctorate—at the University of Richmond, and both an MA and a PhD from Princeton University.

At the time of his death, Carroll was Professor Emeritus of physics at the University of Maryland, College Park, where he taught for 45 years. He is remembered for many accomplishments, from serving as the Principle Investigator for the Apollo 11 Lunar Ranging Retro-Reflector experiment to contributing to the design of a state-of-the art lecture and demonstration hall in the John S. Toll Physics Building.

Carroll's beloved wife Elizabeth Delany Alley, whom he married in 1952, passed away in 2004. He leaves behind two daughters, Frances Alley Kruger and Margaret Alley Seymour; four grandchildren, Rebecca Leigh Brigham, Monica Elizabeth Garrett, Joshua Robert Kruger, and Emily Christine Massucci; as well as two great-grandchildren, Sylvia Elizabeth Brigham and Kason Jaymes Brigham.
